DOUBLET REGAL:

Classification of Classified Documents of the Federation: includes the Van Diemen Papers. One step higher than the Nova Weapons Research Files (TOS: 16, 16).

Level-Eight Classification:

Violation of this level results in permanent incarceration on Rock (TOS: 42, 234).

Lonteen's Light:

Code similar to Morse code (TOS: BD, 346).

Manual Coding

Most secure form of transmission; requires decoding keys kept in paper copy on receiving starship (TOS: 24, 11).

Priority One Clearance:

Classified code issued by Starfleet Command for the most sensitive projects or information (TTM, 25 DS9: 16, 130)

Ultimate Emergency Override Command Code:

The four possible uses for Ultimate Code include the immediate nova of a star, alien invasion, critical experiment failure, or unclassifiable danger never before encountered (TOS: 2, 6).

General Order Six

If everyone in a crew is killed or disabled, and the ship has not received a proper command from an outside authority to disengage, the ship's computer will automatically engage the self-destruct system (STL6: A, 44).

General Order Seven:

Individuals caught approaching Quarantined worlds will face the Death penalty upon conviction (TOS: P).

General Order Twelve:

Concerns rules of engagement. In SPE situation, requires not using shields, weapons, or screens, or ground personnel from using phasers (TOS: 48, 25).

General Regulation Document 227:

Treatment of prisoners on Starfleet vessels

Paragraph B:

Commanding officers reserve the right to visit the accused.

Paragraph C:

Commanding officers are subject to scan prior to visiting the accused.

Maximum Radiation Security Procedure (storm-cellar):

In case of severe levels of radiation, starship crews will abandon outer section of ship and move into interior bulkheads. The increased mass reduces the lethality of radiation (TOS: 6,129).

Perils of Space Rescue Response Clause

Rule that give commanders authority to violate standing orders to rescue distressed vessels (TOS: BD, 8). The regulations also give commanders discretion to not respond to distress calls broadcast by hostile spacecraft (TOS:40, 15).

Regulation 14-B:

Standard cadet maneuver (TOS: SFTS, 57).

Vulcan Variant:

Harder version of standard maneuvers (TOS: SFTS, 57).

Regulation 73-C, Subsection A:

In the event of time travel, all Starfleet personnel will submit to routine psychological profile scan no less than once per solar year. Those of officer rank, or whom medical personnel deem under more than usual stress will be

subjected to scan as frequently as necessary upon recommendation of senior medical officer (TOS: SFTS, 102).

Regulation 157, section 3, paragraph 18:

Starfleet officers shall take all necessary precautions to minimize any participation in historical events (DS9: TT).

Regulation 2477.3:

Starfleet officers will not issue false reports in regards to prisoners as a result of negotiations with prisoners (TOS: 61,129).

Regulation 256.15:

Officers shall show professional behaviors at all times (TOS: VF, 247).

Regulation 927.9:

Starfleet personnel will not willfully put a prisoner's life in danger (TOS: 61, 241).

Emergency Code 193:

Allows Starfleet personnel to open the shuttle bay doors even when someone is inside the bay. Used to allow shuttles to evacuate the ship during a hostile takeover (TOS: 70, 234).

Rule of Seven:

Starfleet regulation that allows Starfleet Admirals to remove captains from active duty; states that commander is unfit to command through no fault of their own. It requires no proof or hearing, though the commanding officer that was demoted can request one (TOS: 5, 25).

Services-Protected Evacuation (SPE):

Starfleet procedure for evacuating Federation personnel from situations of war and civil unrest (TOS:48, 24).

Starfleet Catastrophic Response Code, Section A:

When all forms of communication fail to establish a link between Starfleet vessels and any Federation outposts, all personnel and ordnance will attempt immediate rendezvous at Starfleet Command (TOS: 75, 66).

Starfleet Wartime regulations:

Code One Alert: Issued by Captains cut off from Starfleet Headquarters, allows them to declare war (STA, 243).

Miscellaneous:

A Starfleet vessel must respond if it is capable to any distress call to render assistance (TNG: 55, 59).

Dropping a brig force screen without authorization constitutes a jailbreak (TOS: 62, 98).

Issuing a false intruder alarm constitutes a breach of Security (TOS: 62, 98).

In the case of Stage One Radiation Hazards, inspection personnel must wear ISHA approved protection gear (DS9: 16, 10).

A search period of 48 hours is required for all lost away teams. (TOS: 61, 125)

Excepting only mechanical failure by essential life-support systems, an Intruder Alert - the presence or suspected presence on a Starfleet vessel of an unauthorized alien life form - is to be given the highest priority of all ship emergencies (TOS: 53, Prologue).

Terraforming Bureaus:

Concerned with the growth of Federation colonies. The Bureaus have long argued that the introduction of an artificial interplanetary ecology, one that has been analyzed to its molecular level, the chance of spontaneous and uncontrollable mutations of viruses and diseases can be drastically reduced. (STA, 80). In the 2380s, the Bureau worked to use the alpha mist as an oxygen producer for terraforming projects (STA, 89).

Security Council (TOS: S, 258).

United Contact Council:

A committee composed of Klingon and Federation personnel to determine the sentience of creatures on worlds within the Organian treaty zone.

Warrantors of the Peace:

Formed by Surak during the Reformation, the Warrantors originally here hostages used to ensure that Vulcan did not have a Nuclear War. Each Warrantor or a city=state carried the codes necessary to launch a strike within a capsule embedded in their heart; for the codes to be used, the Warrantor would have to be killed. Warrantors were chosen from those closest to those who led that state. Vulcans emphasized that Warrantors be used to ensure peace through the Federation as well, an idea that was not implemented until the 2260s (TOS: 25, 19).

Section 175 (Subsection B):

The right to mental privacy is an inalienable right of all Federation citizens and shall not be abrogated without due process of law.

Section 183 (Subsection A, Paragraph 5):

No law enforcement agent or person acting in the capacity of a law enforcement agent shall invade or cause to be invaded the mental privacy of any Federation citizen or any other sentient being without first having proved reasonable suspicion before a Federation Justice of the Courts or planetary official serving is a similar capacity.

Section 183 (Subsection A, Paragraph 6):

No law enforcement agent or person acting in the capacity of a law enforcement agent shall invade or cause to be invaded the mental privacy of any innocent Federation citizen or any other sentient being while in pursuit of suspects for whom a search warrant has been obtained under the provisions of Section 183 (Subsection A, Paragraph 5).

Section 243, (Subsection A):

No law enforcement agent or person acting in the capacity of a law enforcement agent shall compel any telepath to use his or her telepathic gifts against his or her will for any reason.

Section 243, (Subsection B):

No law enforcement agent or person acting in the capacity of a law enforcement agent shall compel any telepath to invade the mental privacy of any Federation citizen or any other sentient being for any purpose, including justifiable searches as defined under the provisions of Section 183 (Subsection A, Paragraph 5).

Federation Environmental Statutes:

Section 504-A, paragraph 3: Exploratory vessels and their crews are exempt from transporting alien organisms (TOS: 66, 44).

Federation Interstellar Maritime Collision Regulations:

Rule 38, Paragraph 2: Any death that results from a collision with a spatial anomaly or vessel must be reported to the nearest Starfleet vessel of Scout Class or larger (TOS: 67, 187).

Federation-Level breach of security (TOS: 70, 91).

Federation Telepathic Rights Statues:

Portion of the Federation Code that refers to those with telepathic abilities and how those abilities may be employed by themselves and Federation officials and Starfleet (TOS: 51, 189).

Interstellar Law:

Article 184: Provides for the arrest of individuals of one government to be arrested for murder by another government (ST: VI, 121).

Mail Pennant:

Decal applied to vessels operating under the authority of the UFP; interference to that vessel is a UFP level offense, rather than a standard criminal offense (TOS; BD, 88).

Most Favored Systems Status:

Designation given to trade partners with the Federation (TNG: 53, 92).

Red Sector:

A Diplomatic Treaty agreement between all major powers in the Alpha Quadrant, a Red Sector is declared off limits to all diplomatic or civilian interaction with the outside galaxy (TNG: 67, 66).

Settlement Accords:

Part of the treaty of Organia that defines sentience in regards to colonization rights of a planet for either the Federation or the Klingon Empire within the Treaty Zone. To be labeled sentient, the Accords indicate an alien race understand the concepts of Ownership and practice agriculture (TOS: 53, 21).

Stellar Navigation Law:

Unpowered vessels that travel via solar wind or magnetic fields have right-of-way against owered vessels (TOS: 2, 16)

Federation vessels must maintain a five kilometer distance between themselves and other vessels (TOS: 35, 47)

Uniform Law of Space Salvage:

Any item recovered by a captain of a ship from a wreck abandoned by its captain becomes ship property (TOS: 16, 225).

Miscellaneous:
